

## **Format Conventions for Tire Society Papers**

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**REFERENCE:** Author, U. R. D. and Onetoo, E. S., “**Format Conventions for Tire Society Papers,**” submitted for presentation at the 2011 Tire Society meeting, and for consideration for publication in the journal *Tire Science and Technology*.

**ABSTRACT:** This document provides an example of the formatting conventions which should be applied when preparing papers for submission to The Tire Society. The abstract length should not exceed 300 words.

**KEY WORDS:** Give several key words here that best classify the content of your paper

Generally, manuscripts should follow the format and style conventions of the Society's journal, *Tire Science and Technology*, as described at the following internet link: [http://tiresciencetechnology.org/page/author\\_information](http://tiresciencetechnology.org/page/author_information). These conventions are embodied in the present document, which is intended to exemplify the desired format.

The body of the manuscript follows the abstract and key words; use of an introductory head is optional. Paragraphs in the body of the text should be indented; manuscripts should be double spaced 12-point Times New Roman with one-inch margins. All figures and tables must be called out in order in the manuscript. In-text footnotes are not allowed.

## Units

SI units should be used throughout the text and on the figures. Authors may include other units in parentheses.

## Equations

Display equations are best entered using MathType. Number equations using Arabic numerals in parentheses.

$$\frac{\partial W}{\partial \phi} = \int_x^y z d\phi \quad (1)$$

$$\frac{\partial V}{\partial \phi} = \int_x^y z d\phi \quad (1)$$

Equations in the run of text should be keyed in regular Word text.

## Copyright Issues

Only papers not previously published will be accepted; authors must agree not to publish elsewhere a paper submitted to and accepted by the Journal.

A Transfer of Copyrights form must accompany manuscripts submitted to The Tire Society. The form is available in The Tire Society's manuscript tracking site.

## Conclusion

Manuscripts should be submitted by the corresponding author in MS Word format (not .PDF) directly via the website <http://tiresciencetechnology.allentrack.net/>.

In order to be considered for the Superior Paper Award, manuscripts must be submitted by the due date posted on The Tire Society's main website: [tiresociety.org](http://tiresociety.org).

## *Acknowledgments*

This section is given a second level head and should be one paragraph, placed directly after the body of the manuscript and immediately before the references.

## List of Figure Captions

FIG. 1 — *A list of all figure captions should be included in the manuscript following the references.*

FIG. 2 — *The actual figures should be uploaded as separate files; if there are three figures, there should be three figure files.*

FIG. 1 — *Low res figures are fine for the review process, high res figures are required for print.*

## List of Tables

TABLE 1 — *A list of all table captions should be included in the manuscript following the figure captions (or references if there are no figures).*

TABLE 2 — *The actual tables should be included on separate pages at the end of the manuscript file. An example follows.*

TABLE 1 — *Note that the table caption is placed above the table.*
